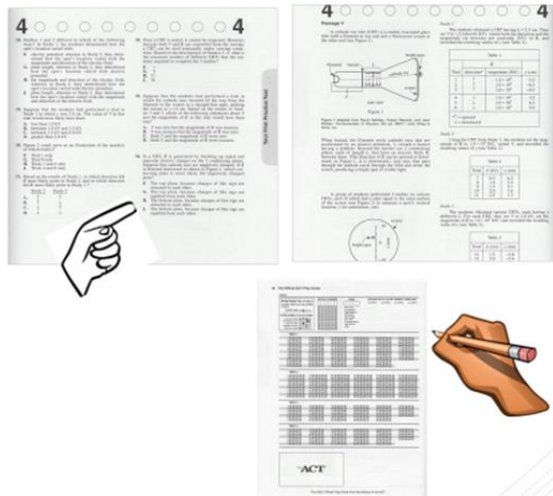

Here are two “bubbling” strategies that you can use if you need just a few more precious seconds to finish your SAT/ACT college entrance exam. Global Vocabulary LLC hopes these timely strategies will be helpful.

Bubbling Strategy One:

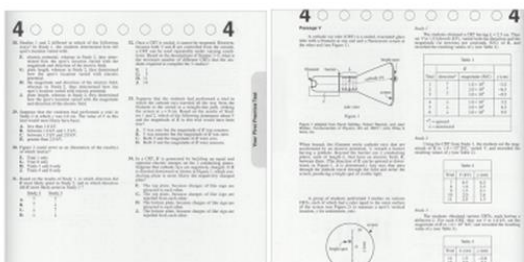
Use both hands!

Dominant hand with pencil bubbles while other hand is placed on corresponding question



Bubbling Strategy Two

Open your test booklet to show both right and left pages.
Circle answers on both pages in booklet and transfer to answer sheet.



- * Reduce time eyes are darting back and forth between the test booklet and your answer sheet.
- * Reduce errors when mind is focused entirely on bubbling.
- * Avoid skipping questions when using this strategy.
